

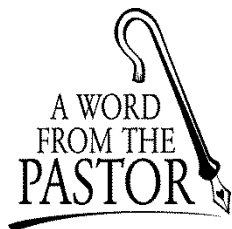

## Pastor Doug's Thoughts on Tolerance and Convictions In a Conflicted World



Traveling recently I came across a bumper sticker that read: "Tolerance is the Luxury of Those without Conviction." The words floated in my mind for a bit. For a moment I could comprehend how someone might say that. Then, I wondered, "What Jesus might think about that bumper sticker?" Jesus was certainly a person of great conviction, sharing God's love and grace with all sorts of people. Jesus preached and read scripture in the temple. Yet, temple authorities were critical of Jesus' healing the sick on the Sabbath and letting his disciples glean grain when hungry on the Sabbath.

In the parable of the "Good Samaritan" Jesus offended those who had contempt for the Samaritans by holding up a Samaritan as an example of compassion. Those who were convinced good people ought to avoid "sinners" and other "less righteous" people were critical of Jesus' eating and drinking with "sinners," as-well-as his visit to the home of a corrupt tax-collector like Zacchaeus.

While Jesus forgave those who repented – while Jesus welcomed sinners – while the Lord also dined with those who were critical of him; one would be hard pressed to say Jesus was a man without conviction. Quite the contrary! Jesus in his love and divine concern for all people (rich or poor – church pillars or church dropouts – Jew or Gentile – standup citizens or scandal ridden souls) stood by his convictions of divine love and righteousness without being self-righteous and intolerant of those who did not share or embrace God's great love for us all. The biblical portrait of Jesus reveals the embodiment of a great conviction that loves those with whom one does not agree and whose values one may not share, without sacrificing faith, conviction or principal.

I wonder if the bumper sticker I saw conveyed more an attitude of masked self-righteousness and a judgmental spirit rather than a firm faith and conviction which can stand strong and compassionate without being antagonistic or wishy-washy.

There is a dangerous temptation to discount those who accept others without accepting differences in conviction, belief or behavior. Conviction and tolerance need not be exclusive. Heart-felt convictions need not force us to discount others because we aren't where they are. This may be worth considering as we deal with those with whom we find little in common in our daily conversations and relationships. Imagine how the world might be improved if we understood and embraced more of Jesus' approach to others. Paul's letter of 1 Corinthians 13 is worth reviewing regarding how we handle our convictions and one another. It's something to consider in a month of valentines.

## A Tent City Ministry Update



The advent of the new year brought a flurry of court activity involving Tent City resulting in a ruling in Ocean County Superior Court that will allow the dwellers to remain in Lakewood for the foreseeable future. Perhaps the most important facet of the proceeding was the Court's recognition that government has a responsibility to the poor.

It is clear from the outpouring and support of our congregation that we hear our Lord's call to extend care and concern to these struggling neighbors. In January, the first meeting of the Tent City Relief Committee was held to clarify the direction of our ministry in this area as we seek to faithfully direct the energy and resources provided by our denomination, our presbytery, our church members and friends, and members of the community who wish to provide aid to Tent City through us. What started as a commitment on the part of the Board of Deacons to regularly deliver eggs and water as finances permitted has blossomed into regular deliveries of eggs, water, clothing, blankets and other items needed by those in the encampment; a successful work day at Tent City held by our youth groups and supportive adults; and continued interest on the part of our congregation to provide assistance to our brothers and sisters in need.

The next meeting of the Tent City Relief Committee will be held on February 19th at 10:15 a.m. in the Church Family Life Center. You are invited to grab a cup of coffee and a baked treat at the coffee hour and join us as we brainstorm and plan for some exciting ways to continue to share our congregation's concern with our neighbors in need. ## Preventive Recommendations of Immunization for All Adults



### Immunizations

Living healthy includes having immunizations at the right time. Please discuss these recommendation with your doctor!

Age Group	18-20	21-29	30-34	35-39	40-44	45-49	50-64	65-69	70+
TB Booster	One booster dose every 10 years								
HPV Vaccine	Women 26 and younger not previously vaccinated (3 doses at 0, 2, 6 months apart)								
Flu Vaccine	One dose yearly								
Hepatitis B Vaccine	3 doses over 6 months for those at risk of exposure								
Hepatitis A Vaccine	2 doses over 6-18 months for those at risk								
MMR Vaccine	At least 1 dose for adults born in 1957 or later and not previously infected or vaccinated. (Some may need second dose.) Don't get pregnant or plan to become pregnant in the next four weeks.							Certain high-risk groups	
Varicella Vaccine	2 doses 4-8 weeks apart if not previously vaccinated or infected with chicken pox. <i>Don't get pregnant or plan to become pregnant in the next four weeks.</i>								
Pneumococcal Vaccine	1-2 doses for anyone with chronic medical conditions or weakened immune systems. One dose revaccination after 5 years is recommended for conditions that affect the immune system. <i>Residents of nursing homes and smokers should be vaccinated.</i>							One dose if never vaccinated or if vaccinated $\geq$ 5 years ago under the age of 65	
Zoster								One dose for adults aged $\geq$ 60 years

## DID YOU KNOW???

... that the Presbyterian Church USA sponsors 5 missionaries in China?

“The church in China is experiencing a new unity in Christ and describes their church life as ‘post-denominational.’ They are determined to nourish this newfound unity in the face of potential fragmentation. Yet, at the same time, the church recognizes the rich diversity of the various traditions and communions out of which they have come. Since 1979 the number of churches has increased dramatically. There are over 50,000 churches and ‘meeting points’ open for public worship, among which more than 70 percent are newly built. The total number of Protestant believers is estimated at 20 million.” *(Quote from the Presbyterian Church USA website)*



The religions in China include Taoist, Buddhist, Christian and Muslim. It is encouraging to find various signs of Christianity in China. It was wonderful to see the Bible in a hotel drawer in Shanghai. With our prayer and support we can continue to spread Christianity.
